Special Education Lead Update	 E. Kaldeway Special Education Leads provided training for new software to all Special Education Resource Teachers and support in using the software to develop the Individual Education Plans this fall. Those first drafts were sent home to families last week. Applied Behaviour Analysis Leads have been working with schools to support students who were in our system last year and new students with diagnoses of Autism Spectrum Disorder as they navigate the transition to their new classrooms and schools. They have been 	



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	 collaborating to set new goals for students based on their first month of transition and growth. Speech-language pathologists have set up Speech-Language Assistants with students and they have been working on developing new programming and assessments for new referrals. Teacher diagnosticians are administering assessments, writing reports and meeting with families to review recommendations for support that focus on student strengths. The Special Education Leads were able to join the curriculum team for a day of learning together and an opportunity to add the voice of students who need special education supports. Conversations continue around implementing the science of reading/ science of the Right to Read inquiry. It was a fabulous day of learning together and the Special Education Leads are very excited about sharing what we learned with the system and using it to increase student success for everyone.
