| Special Education Lead Update | J. Theriault IPRC's are continuing to occur across the system. Primary Education and Community Partnership Program (ECPP) candidates are being brought forward. Examples of our ECPPs are Firefly, SPARK, Transitions North. Special Education Leads are having ongoing conversations with school teams to discuss the importance of building independence and developing skills to set students up for success. Special Education Resource Teachers had professional development with the Ontario Disabilities Employment Network (ODEN). The presentation focused on having high expectations, exploring interests, the importance of developing skills as well as the importance of co-op opportunities for ALL high school students. | Board Improvement and Equity Plan | C. Moore provided a brief overview of the Board Improvement and Equity Plan, highlighting specific areas such as: Goals were set based on data and student need. We are focused on high impact teaching strategies and culturally relevant and responsive pedagogy. Students can demonstrate their learning through observation, conversation and product. In math, we encourage and honour different approaches to solving problems. In literacy, we encourage the use of relevant text, our plan is aligned with structured reading which is a recommendation in the Ontario Human Rights Inquiry. We promote School Mental Health Ontario and Restorative Practices which are evidence based practices. We understand the importance of involving our families, staff, community partners and agencies to support student needs. De-streaming grade 9 is important Equity work that allows students another year before pathways choices begin. We honour all pathways, and work towards ensuring equitable access to opportunities. | |
