Trustee Determination and Distribution for 2022 Election

Before each election, the Board of Trustees determines the number of Trustee positions on their Board and distributes these positions across the Board's area of jurisdiction. This process is known as Trustee Determination and Distribution (D&D).

By March 31 of an election year, School Boards are required to complete a Determination and Distribution Report showing their D&D calculations, and, by April 3 in the election year, to submit it to:

- the Minister of Education;
- the election clerks for all municipalities within the KPDSB's jurisdiction; and
- the secretary of every other board that is wholly or partially within KPDSB's area of jurisdiction.

The Trustee determination and distribution process plays an important role in ensuring that representation on School Boards is democratic and fair. It also allows Trustee candidates to identify and select an electoral ward in which to run. Therefore, it is very important for School Boards to make accurate determination and distribution calculations.

The Trustee Determination and Distribution calculations will be very similar to the 2018 election. The electoral count in the district totals 25,973 for 2022, a reduction of 900 potential voters (or 3.4%). KPDSB is still looking at having 10 elected trustees in 2022.

One of the decisions to be made is to determine how KPDSB will distribute the Trustee representation. There are 2 choices:

- 1. Representation by population. This would result in the following distribution for 2022:
 - a. Kenora area 4
 - b. Dryden area 3
 - c. Red lake area 1
 - d. Sioux Lookout area 1
 - e. Ignace / P Lake area 1

- 2. Alternate distribution to low population areas in 2022 (similar to the 2018 election). For this choice, KPDSB, through a Board Resolution, would have to designate one (1) or more municipalities within KPDSB's jurisdiction as "low population" areas.
 - 3 a. Kenora area b. Dryden 1 c. Machin 1 d. Red Lake 1 e. Sioux Lookout 1 f. Ignace 1 g. Ear Falls 1 h. Pickle Lake 1

For 2022, KPDSB has designated the following municipalities as low population municipalities:

- Township of Ignace
- Township of Ear Falls
- Township of Pickle Lake

This would result in each of the Kenora and Dryden areas losing one (1) Trustee position in the distribution.

KEY DATES

- March 31, 2022 Boards must pass resolutions determining Trustee distribution for the 2022 election.
- May 1, 2022 Beginning of nominations and campaign period.
- August 19, 2022 Last day for filing nomination and withdrawal of candidacy.
- October 24, 2022 Voting Day.
- November 15, 2022 Trustees' term of office begins.
