School Sharing Report All Schools	Shauna Valleyview School  PRO Grant:  Part 1: We have partnered with the BBSS Bronco Builder with Mr. Chris Hopkins and his students to cut the lumber needed for 336 Nesting Bird houses. We reached out to the MNR to ask about important projects that could tie	



into our Trades Week (April 25-29) and that would positively impact our bird population in our area. Chris and his student cut to length, drilled holes, packaged hardware and wrapped them up for our student to take home. This section of the Trades we will give the students the chance to be a contractor and carpenter. They will be picked up by families during our open house night Wednesday April 13, 2022.

 Part 2: We sourced 340 doughballs from Black Oven. Sharalei Cunningham will provide us with 1 large doughball per student to take home on the Friday of the Trades Week. We have sourced a cauliflower crust option for our gluten sensitive students as this event is to be as inclusive as we can.

Our VP Kristen Fregeau has done a phenomenal job with this week and this year she has reached out to other schools in the board to join her lead with this. We have a lot of VV parents in the trades already stepping up to do presentations within the school. It is going to be a great experience for the students and School council is happy to provide additional support.

	Staying Safe with Needles With the snow melting, discarded needles may appear. Talking to your kids about needles may be uncomfortable, but it is important for children to know what to do if they find a needle or other sharp objects on the ground. You can talk about needles in an age-appropriate manner. For example, for younger children having this conversation does not need to include talking about drugs and addiction; but for older children, you can teach them about the dangers of injection drug use. Remind your children that there are many things on the ground that can harm them and teach them not to touch anything that they find on the ground that does not belong to them.
