Buswa reported that there was a strong nudge by the Ministry of Education for school boards to remove tuition barriers for students to gain access to education</li> <li>• Tania shared that KPDSB is playing a lead role in this work</li> <li>• A. Kivell explained that he was surprised to learn that the F10 was being done away with in KPDSB and wondering who was consulted on this decision.</li> <li>• Tania explained that even though the F10 is no longer a requirement, that the board will work with individual bands and councils to develop agreements that get their communities the</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Invite S. <p>8. Board Improvement Plan</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Before turning the agenda over, D. Buswa introduced the new Superintendent of Education, T. Sterling as new KPDSB staff member who is responsible for the IEAC portfolio</li> <li>• T. Sterling thanked Elder Landon for the opening prayer and everyone for coming</li> <li>• She gave some background about her experience in K12 education prior to accepting the position in KPDSB, including working in Nunavut with the Ministry of Education</li> <li>• She described the different approach that is being taken this year to develop the Board Improvement Plan (BIP). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ In the past, the BIP was finalized in September and was based on the provincial data that flowed from the previous years' EQAO and OSSLT results. This process did not incorporate other school-based data and new student needs as identified for the current cohort in our schools.</li> <li>○ This year, KPDSB saw large increases in enrolment after Labour Day across our board.</li> <li>○ This year, instead of finalizing School Improvement Plans (SIP) in September, schools were been given an extra month to fully assess the new needs presented by</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2017-2018 Board Improvement Plan to be shared with committee members at February 2018 meeting</li> </ul>

	<p>the new student body (due by end of October).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ The Senior Admin team will collate the SIPs in November, and devise a DRAFT that will then be taken out to schools for consultation.</li> <li>○ The final plan will be shared at the December board meeting</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• L. Barnes agreed with the new approach to the developing this year's BIP and emphasized the importance of establishing baseline data regarding needs analysis to be able to identify areas of growth over time</li> </ul>	
9. FNMI Final Report 2016-2017	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• T. Sterling explained that the final 2016-2017 FNMI report was sent to the Ministry September 29, 2017 and despite the Ministry funding \$141, 930, KPDSB spent \$398, 947.27 to support the wide range of programs and needs in and for our Indigenous students and communities.</li> <li>• As this year's programs are expanded, and data continues to support positive change, we will need to advocate for more funding from the Ministry</li> </ul>	
10. 2017-2018 Board Assessment Tool for Indigenous Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• T. Sterling lead the review of the 2016-2017 and facilitated conversation to gather input from committee on setting priorities for 2017-2018 Board Action Plan (see attached)</li> </ul>	
11. Acknowledging Traditional Territory Announcement (next steps)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• As a follow up to last meeting, KPDSB has left the decision on the development of and type of Land Acknowledgement to individual schools</li> <li>• This information is not found on the KPDSB website</li> <li>• Administrators are encouraged to work with Elders within local communities to co-develop a land acknowledgment that is respectful and representative of the community and territory</li> <li>• Eleanor reminded us that it is important to think about the purpose behind the Land Acknowledgement</li> <li>• Eleanor will also follow up with Elder Steven Kejick for guidance so she can then inform schools who are asking for assistance</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tania to work with Sheena to post a notice outlining the board's recommendation regarding the creation of Land Acknowledgments in schools</li> <li>• Eleanor to bring an update to our next meeting following her conversation with Elder Steven Kejick</li> </ul>
12. MOE Indigenous Curriculum Update	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• D. Buswa made the committee aware of the changes that are underway to Grades 4-6, 7-8 History to reflect the Truth and Reconciliation and as part of the Ontario Education and Equity Action Plan. Curriculum needs to be inclusive of FNMI history and people in Canada</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bring new curriculum to next meeting if available</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Curriculum is being revised now and will be distributed in 2017-2018</li> <li>• Boards will have funds to prepare teachers and provide implementation supports</li> <li>• Mandatory implementation of the new curriculum is expected for 2018-2019.</li> </ul>

Buswa announced that this is her last IEAC meeting as she is stepping down as the Indigenous Trustee Representative as of November 30, 2017.</li> <li>• T. Sterling thanked her on behalf of the board and shared a letter that Director S. Monteith had asked be read aloud to the committee (see attached)</li> <li>• Trustee Chair, Dave Penney let Desta know there have been a few people who have come forward to run for this seat</li> <li>• In accordance with Policy 200 &amp; 206, the next Indigenous Trustee will be from Treaty 3</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Once the new Indigenous Trustee is elected, IEAC will be advised (Dec 2017)</li> <li>• Tania to reach out and welcome the next Indigenous Trustee in December and help him/her prepare for the February teleconference meeting</li> </ul>

New Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eleanor reminded everyone of Treaty Week November 5-11, 2017</li> <li>• The Ministry has made funding available for her to work with secondary schools to celebrate Treaty Week;</li> <li>• Last year was the first year and the presentations were more issues-based; this year's presentations are more focused on the history of Anishinabe traditions</li> </ul>
