Full-Day Early Learning-Kindergarten Program

Background Information:

In 2009, the Ministry of Education announced plans for the implementation of a Full-Day Early Learning-Kindergarten Program (FDELKP) for all four-and five-year-olds in the province. The goal was to have all publically funded schools in Ontario have FDELKP in place by the 2014/2015 school year. The Ministry of Education provided funding and support to ensure the successful implementation of the program.

Goal of the Full-Day Early Learning-Kindergarten Program:

The goal of the FDELKP is to provide students with a smoother transition into Grade One and to assist children in developing the social and academic skills necessary for school and life. The FDELKP will be monitored and reviewed to ensure ongoing successful implementation of the program.

Full-Day Early Learning-Kindergarten Program:

- Four-and five-year old students will attend school every day all day in this program
- A qualified Primary Classroom Teacher and Early Childhood Educator will work together to implement the program
- The program will have an average of 26 students, therefore there will be a ratio of 13 students for each educator
- The program builds strong foundations for our youngest learners and prepares them for the primary school years which begin in Grade One
- The FDELKP is a two year program where students learn not only from the teacher and ECE, but also from their peers
- The Ministry developed a new curriculum document to ensure all five development domains (emotional, social, communication/language, cognitive and physical) were included from both the previous Kindergarten Curriculum Document and Early Childhood Educators Document
- Teachers received training from the Ministry, as well as from the Keewatin-Patricia District School Board, by the board's Early Learning Lead Administrator to implement the program and curriculum

KPDSB's Full-Day Early Learning-Kindergarten Program:

- This school year the FDELKP is fully implemented across the board, as per the Ministry's plan
- The board currently offers 25 full day programs in each of our 16 elementary schools
- The board also offers a French Immersion FDELKP at Valleyview PS in Kenora
- Registration for the FDELKP is done all year long, but there will be a special registration week from January 26-30 at each of our elementary public schools
- The schools will provide information to families, provide tours, as well as families can check out the FDELKP classrooms

- Responsible for the organization, administration and management of the School Effectiveness Framework
- Responsible for building the capacity of principals and supervisory officers to ensure effective School Self-Assessments and District Processes
- Providing updates through the director to the board of trustees
- Involved in board improvement planning
- Supporting principals with the development of School Improvement Plans
- Begin familiar with school data and monitoring closely in order to support the closing of achievement gaps
- Fostering networks that assume collective responsibility and accountability for student achievement

Ministry Tools or Supports Specific To This Work Include:

The School Effectiveness Framework, 2013

This K– 12 resource is "a tool for board and school self-assessment and planning. It is grounded in research based practices which are described at the district, school, classroom and student level; what the practices look like and sound like". Indicators from the School Effectiveness Framework are the backbone of the strategies of the Board Strategic Improvement Plan

The Ontario Leadership Framework, 2012

This document "describes what good leadership looks like based on evidence of what makes the most difference to student achievement and well-being".

- Plan, Act, Observe, Reflect...conversations based on cycle of inquiry and reflect a cycle themselves; not a once per year drop in for monitoring purposes but a means to work together to continue to build our learning organization
- Focused on principal leadership to influence teacher impact on student achievement
- For this year, enhanced attention to teacher collaborative inquiry process for professional learning, which is explicitly driven by the learning needs of the students
- Enhanced focus on how learning how to "measure" our impact on student thinking and learning
- Enhanced attention to learning about "implementation"; the "how" of the "what"
- A process for capturing leadership learning, cause and effect
- Making explicit the connection from the students' learning needs to the professional learning needs of the teachers to the School Improvement Plan, to the Board Strategic Improvement Plan

Professional Learning Supports Include

- Principal as Partner leadership conversations
- Principal Learning Team sessions with the goal of "all principals facilitate impactful professional learning for teachers, which influences student achievement through high quality classroom practice".
- Teacher release for professional learning during the working day.
- A wealth of ministry and other resource materials to inform teacher inquiry

External Audit Committee Members

Ontario Regulation 361/10 *Audit Committees* sets out the following requirement for the composition of school board audit committees:

"If the board has eight or more board members, but less than fifteen, the audit committee shall consist of five members, including three board members and two persons who are not board members."

To be eligible for appointment to a school board audit committee, an external member must have accounting, financial management or other relevant business experience that would enable him or her to understand the accounting and auditing standards applicable to the board. As well, the external member must not be an employee or officer of the Board; and the external member must not have a parent, child, or spouse employed by the Board.

The term of an external audit committee member cannot exceed three years and external audit committee members may normally be appointed for no more than two terms.

There is no remuneration paid to external audit committee members. Out of pocket expenses incurred in carrying out committee duties may be reimbursed in accordance with Policy 210.
