KPDSB Adult Education – 2016 Summary Report

The Keewatin Patricia District School Board is a leader in delivery of Adult Education services in Northwestern Ontario, providing access and support to high quality flexible programing that allows all of our learners to pursue and earn their Ontario Secondary School Diploma. (OSSD). In order to effectively build and deliver programming, we have developed partnerships with various organizations and service providers.

With our partners at Seven Generations Education Institute, we serve adult students in the following municipalities: Sioux Lookout, Red Lake, Ear Falls, Ignace, Pickle Lake, Kenora, and Dryden, as well as twelve First Nations from Treaty #3, including: Wabigoon Lake, Eagle Lake, Lac Seul, Wabauskang, Ochiichagwe'Babigo'Ining, Obashkaandagaang, and Wauzhushk Onigum. Course delivery is through an enhanced self-study model, with students working with qualified teacher/tutor, at home, or online through Google Classroom. The Red Lake Literacy Association, the various Indigenous Friendship Centres in our communities and other service providers also help to provide access for adults to participate in our programs.

Each year, we serve between 600 and 700 adults each year, and have approximately 40 graduates.

MenoYaWin - Adult and Continuing Education Single Parent Initiative Pilot Program

This is a unique partnership in the Sioux Lookout area that delivers adult education services to adults, caregivers and their children that are receiving services from the MenoYaWin Health Center. These are primarily clients from Treaty 9 and Treaty 5 communities. A total of 90 adults from 25 different northern communities attended the program in 2016. All 90 participants are self-identified as First Nation, Métis, or Inuit. Their children, who are normally federal pupils, attend school in Sioux Lookout when their parents or caregivers are in Sioux Lookout. We are very pleased with this work to help engage, serve, and support adult learners and their children to continue on their education journey.

Sioux Lookout Area Aboriginal Management Board - Adult Education Projects

The Keewatin Patricia District School Board (KPDSB) is proud to be partners with the Sioux Lookout Area Aboriginal Management Board (SLAAMB) in various Adult Education Delivery Projects for adults in the Sioux Lookout area and northern communities, as selected by SLAAMB. Students have an opportunity to earn Ontario secondary school compulsory course credits and/or upgrade Mathematics and English courses. Ontario Secondary School Diplomas will be granted for students who fulfil Ontario graduation requirements.

Looking Forward

Our continued development of collaborative relationships with First Nation partners and communities, built on a foundation of mutual respect and shared expertise, are the cornerstone of our Adult Education regional strategy moving forward. All of our programs help stimulate and respond to the demand for learning in the north and also respond to the adult learning needs in the region.

- Our work is well positioned to cultivate our new partnerships with First Nation organizations such as Keewaytinook Okimakanak and Nishnawbe Aski Nation to provide innovative, culturally relevant programming to adult students, offering them opportunities to develop and refine the skills that will allow them to open doors to future employment and postsecondary education. We continue to implement various creative initiatives to help adults access courses, by providing hybrid learning which consists of both online and face-to-face learning. We are promoting our programs in various mediums to help increase public awareness of our services and to further engage adults to access and pursue their education. We are planning more professional development opportunities for our adult education staff and administration around 21st Century learning tools, course development, new promising pedagogical practices, and other opportunities that will further improve our programs
- With the Ministry of Education and our partners, we are building a comprehensive Adult Education Regional Strategic Plan. One goal of the strategy is to build on the existing strength of education programs and partnerships to provide access to quality education to help prepare our returning adult secondary students for the jobs of today and tomorrow. We wish to foster a shared sense of responsibility for adult learners through improved collaboration and coordination in the region to provide equity of access to consistent high-quality programs and services for adults throughout the region.

As always, we continue our commitment to putting all students first, helping all our learners succeed in reaching their goals, and assisting in creating a positive vision of their future, as they strive towards graduating secondary school and beyond.
