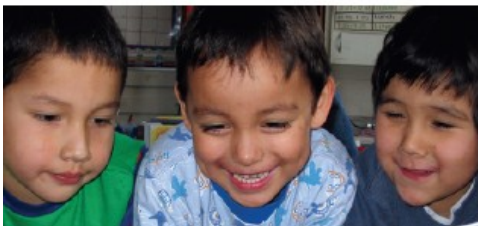
## The Full-Day Early Learning— Kindergarten Program

The Full-Day Early Learning—Kindergarten Program (FDELKP) is an all day, every day program for students who are four and five years of age. The program builds strong foundations for our youngest learners and prepares them for the primary school years.

FDELKP classrooms have both a qualified classroom teacher and a certified early childhood educator (ECE), allowing for more personalized attention for each student.

The FDELKP is a two year program where students learn not only from the teacher and ECE, but also from their peers. Students in year two of the program (formerly called Senior Kindergarten) learn about leadership and mentoring by working with the year one students (formerly called Junior Kindergarten). There is also a new curriculum for the FDELKP.

Like our regular Kindergarten program, it focuses on the physical, social, emotional, and cognitive development of all children with the added benefit of more personalized attention for each student with two qualified adults teaching in the classroom.



## Supporting Our Youngest Learners

A new curriculum, based largely on existing Kindergarten and early learning programs, has been developed for the Early Learning Program.

The program establishes strong foundations for learning in the early years, in a safe and caring play-based environment. It is child centered, developmentally appropriate for children four- and five-years old, and allows for a full day of integrated learning for all children.
