HIGHLIGHTS		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The Chief Medical Officer of Health recommends that all those under 65 years of age receive the pandemic H1N1 vaccine first, and then receive a seasonal influenza vaccine. ▪ Those over 65 or residing in long-term care homes are recommended to receive their seasonal influenza vaccine now. ▪ The NWHU will be structuring this season's immunization program to meet the Ministry recommendations.

CONTROL MEASURES		
<p>Use the following routine infection prevention practices to help prevent and control the spread of influenza:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Stay home when you are running a fever or feeling very unwell. ▪ Use masks with caution, and only for brief periods. They become contaminated inside and outside, and only protect against particles that land directly on nose or mouth. ▪ Maintain some distance from those coughing and sneezing. ▪ Teach and practice cough and sneeze etiquette, and effective hand hygiene. SCHOOLS & CHILD CARE FACILITIES

Closures: the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) has issued advice to schools and daycares indicating that they should remain open; and that sick children, teachers and caregivers should stay home.
